Participants receive a training grant of €6,600 and may also apply to Enterprise Ireland for CORD funding which could provide up to 50% of previous year's salary.

applications for MWEP 2008. Participants should have an innovative business idea with growth and export potential. They should be graduates (diploma level or higher) with a number of years' industry experience and have the enthusiasm and drive necessary to develop and grow a successful business.

Ten high potential entrepreneurs from the Midlands are participating on the current MWEP - products being developed include pharmaceutical gels, a bearingless motor, a biodegradable plastic, telecoms software and a high-yielding thermal solar panel.
